Institute of Judaica Activity Report 2019

In 2019, the Institute worked on a number of important projects in more than 20 cities of Ukraine. Educational, research and social projects were devoted to research in the field of Jewish history and culture, dissemination of information about Jewish life in Ukraine among Jewish and non-Jewish audiences, work with teachers and students of Ukraine in the field of tolerance education.

1. Educational projects.

1.1. The project "Education of Tolerance and Combating Discrimination within Ukrainian Society by Studying Jewish History and Culture" was supported by the Human Rights Foundation of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Netherlands and supported by the Dar Charitable Foundation and the Ukrainian-Jewish Meeting Foundation in cooperation with the educational institutions of Mykolayiv, Ternopil and Ivano-Frankivsk regions.

The project was implemented during 2019 in three regions of Ukraine, in which 96 teachers from 26 cities of Ukraine took part in the teachers' seminars. 189 secondary school pupil- guides were trained, who worked at the three exhibitions in 15 cities of Ukraine with a number of visitor nearly 29 thousand.

The work was organized as follows:

<u>The first stage</u> included preliminary preparation and coordination of the project with government agencies (city and regional education departments, school principals, teachers).

<u>The second stage</u> included teachers' seminars, in which the participants got acquainted with the project and the exhibitions. The seminars included lecture cycles, excursions to three exhibitions, practical classes on in-depth study of the history and culture of Ukrainian Jewry. The practical part of the seminars consisted of trainings aimed at understanding various aspects of tolerance, learning ways of overcoming historical and social stereotypes, the ability to recognize methods and techniques of propaganda and manipulation of consciousness, as well as to actively counteract them.

<u>The third stage</u> included th eguides' seminars, in which young guides got four-day training sessions the methods of organizing an dconducting excursions, learned the skills of a guide, mastered in lectures and comprehended during the training a huge amount of information, learned to critically interpret information, recognize and counter and overcome propaganda. The group work allowed each participant not only to learn the actual material of the exhibitions, but also master the ability to conduct tours with visitors of different ages.

<u>The fourth stage</u> was the work of exhibitions in the cities of Ukraine, attended by students, teachers, parents, journalists, local residents, as well as local authorities. Young guides conducted tours, organized discussions, answered questions.

Members of the Mnemosina Club take part in the archival programs of the Institute of Judaica.

In 2019, travel-expeditions for members of the club's club in the Ukrainian cities of Ukraine were organized.

The project "«Born in Shtetl»" is a joint project of the Institute of Judaism with the Regional Association of Jewish Communities of Ukraine and the Zionist Federation of Ukraine. The project worked in the cities: Skvira, Vasilkov, Smela, Brovary, Korsun-Shevchenkovsky.

The project «Born in Shtetl» is dedicated to the contribution of immigrants from Ukrainian lands to the creation of the state of Israel.

Presentations of the project on the basis of the exhibition were supplemented by materials about people from the so-called «Place of the Association» — cities and towns that are members of the Regional Association of Small Jewish Communities.

The project was carried out by the Regional Association of Small Jewish Communities of Kiev and Cherkasy regions together with the ZFU the basis of the exhibition "State of Israel - Ukrainian Roots", prepared by the Zionist Federation of Ukraine in cooperation with the Kyiv Institute of Judaica for the 70th anniversary of Independence of the State of Israel.

The exhibition was presented in the cities: Korsun-Shevchenkovsky, Vasilkov, Stavyshche, Smela, Brovary and others.

The presentation also included information about people from these towns

or villages who also contributed to the creation of the Jewish State.
